- Low-income Veterans
- Those able and willing to contribute 500 hours of Sweat Equity in building their home and the homes of their future neighbors
- Those who want to help others in need by becoming long-term partners with SGV Habitat
- Low-income applicants only. Income cannot exceed 60% of Area Median Income (AMI)
- Additional restrictions may apply
