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LETTER OF INTEREST GUIDELINES

PHYSICAL THERAPIST

Eastern Los Angeles Regional Center (ELARC) is accepting applications for the following Purchase of Service (POS):

Service Code / Type: Service Code 116 – Early Start Specialized Therapeutic Services, Physical Therapist for Children Ages 0 to 3

Reimbursement: Negotiable up to the Current Median Rate

Preferred Languages: Bilingual Spanish/English, Bilingual Cantonese/English, Bilingual Mandarin/English

Service Description:

Physical Therapist – The primary role of the physical therapist is to conduct physical therapy evaluations which include gross motor development and developmental evaluations. The developmental evaluations need to include levels of functioning in all five developmental domains. In addition to this, the occupational therapist develops and provides a treatment plan, reviews needs and assesses for adaptive equipment as well as provide ongoing physical therapy services for children under the age of three.

Physical Therapists will be required to submit detailed reports for items such as recommended intervention strategies, measurable goals and status updates on all identified areas of need. Reports must be accurate and complete for each individual served and completed every 6 months.

General Requirements:

Applicants must be validly licensed as a Physical Therapist by the Physical Therapy Board of California.

A minimum of two years early intervention experience in working with children at risk for having a developmental disability(ies) in the 0 -3 age range/pediatric group in a clinical and/or hospital based setting is preferred.

Applicants must have experience in completing developmental assessments using standardize testing tools (DAYC 2, Bayley - 4, and Peabody)

Applicants must adhere to all applicable laws and regulations as described in the Title 17 California Code of Regulations and the Business and Professions Code for the Physical Therapy Board of California.

Applicants must be comfortable providing services in the individual's or family's home. All services must be provided in the family home or other natural environment. No center-based services are to be provided under this service code. Trailer Bill AB 136 amended Government Code section 95020(d)(5)(A), specifying that early intervention services may be delivered by remote electronic communications. (Amendment effective 7/29/2021)

- Professional resume
- A copy of current Physical Therapy license
- Current printout from the Physical Therapy Board of California showing that the applicant's license is current and in good standing
- A sample assessment and a sample progress report
- A description of which testing tools and measurements will be used during assessments
